 Ordinance #2014-12: An Ordinance Limiting Senior Citizen Sales Tax
 Exemption to Those Who Have Obtained and Maintained an Exemption
 Based Upon a Qualifying Application Submitted by December 31, 2019

The ordinance, if passed by the assembly, will be presented to the voters at the October 7, 2014 election. (If approved by the voters, no senior exemption cards would be issued after December 31, 2019. Seniors that have qualified to obtain, obtained or maintained exemption cards by December 31, 2019 will continue to be able to use their existing card after the sunset date).

F. <u>ORD#14-17</u> Ordinance #2014-17: An Ordinance Providing to Impose an Excise Tax on Cigarettes and Other Tobacco Products

If approved by the assembly, the ordinance will be referred to the voters at the October 7, 2014 municipal election. If approved by the voters, a wholesale excise tax of \$2.00 per pack of cigarettes (plus an annual Consumer Price Index adjustment,) and 45% of the wholesale price on other tobacco products, will be placed on those products that are brought into the Borough to be offered for sale.

G. <u>ORD#14-18</u> Ordinance #2014-18: An Ordinance Providing for Chapter 3.85 (Historic Preservation) of the Municipal Code and Providing for an Appointed Advisory Commission
