#### Ordinances for Third and Final Reading

A. Ordinance #2019-09: An Ordinance Amending Chapter 4.28, "Sales Tax", of the Borough Code to Clarify that Sales of Marijuana and Marijuana Products to Non-profit Organizations and Senior Citizens are Subject to the Borough Sales Tax

Ordinance #2019-09 will clarify in Borough Code that sales of marijuana and marijuana products to non-profit organizations and senior citizens are subject to Borough sales tax. The ordinance was amended in its first reading to add language to the definition of marijuana excluding hemp or CBD products. The amended ordinance passed unanimously in its first and second readings.

Bids received for the Scow Bay 1 Pump Station Upgrade project placed expenses over and above the ADEC loan amount secured for the project. If approved, Ordinance #2019-13 will transfer Wastewater Department reserves to the Scow Bay 1 Pump Station Upgrade capital project fund in order to make an award to the lowest responsive bidder. The Wastewater Department will be preparing a loan increase application for ADEC's consideration with the goal of returning this supplemental funds transfer amount of \$194,695 back to department reserves when the loan increase for the project is approved. Ordinance #2019-14 will provide a method of determining the full and true value of a property that qualifies for low-income housing tax credits per Alaska Statute 29.45.110. This method is based on the actual income of the property to encourage the private sector to develop affordable housing projects within local communities.
