Recycling Survey Data November 17, 2014

Public Works Director Karl Hagerman provided a report on the commingled recycling program that included results of a community recycling survey. The written report indicated the public is generally very pleased with the program; the blue bag program received a fair amount of support, but changing to a cart based program was desired by the users; the borough needs to increase public knowledge and understanding of the program rules; users of the service prefer to retain a weekly pickup versus a

bi-weekly pickup; the recycling program achieved a 16% recycling rate (the program goal is 30% by 2017); the program is within budget for the year; recycling shipment costs are considerably lower that solid waste shipping (\$96.90 less per ton); and the residents and businesses are very happy with the pickup service provided by the contracting hauler - Ruger's Trucking.

The report contained three options for the future of the program: 1) continue the current blue bag program, 2) go to cart based recycling, alternating weeks between garbage and recyclables collections; and 3) go to a weekly cart based recycling and garbage pick-up service. Both options 2 and 3 would be performed by borough staff, eliminating the annual expense for a contracted pick-up company and purchase of blue bags. However, both options 2 and 3 would require a considerable up-front cost for carts and an additional truck. Option 3 would also require a reduction in the hours the baler is open during the week to the public that bring their trash directly to the sight. None of the options were expected to require additional staff. Hagerman and the sanitation department recommended the borough migrate to option 3.

A Q & A session followed the presentation.

By a Roll Call Vote of 4-2 (Members Havrilek and Lynn opposed) the Assembly accepted the department's recommendation and directed that for budget preparation purposes only, to prepare the upcoming budget based on moving to a weekly cart based recycling program. Havrilek preferred a bi-weekly program.
