Ordinance #2017-15: An Ordinance of the Petersburg Borough Adjusting the FY 2018 Budget for Known Changes

Ordinance #2017-15, if adopted, will spend down remaining reserves from the Roads Special Revenue Fund to pay for the Asphalt Crushing Project (this expense was approved by the Assembly in September); will reduce the Police Department payroll expense due to the loss of Airport Security Officer revenue from the State of Alaska and therefore a reduction in a police officer position; will add \$39,500 to the PMPL budget for Superintendent recruiting costs; will increase budgeted funds to pay for the PMPL 350 Generator Replacement that was budgeted for in the prior year but not paid; will budget for the Rasmuson grant awarded to the Library and the expense incurred for the Story Totem Pole; will budget from the Economic Fund the local cost sharing for development of the Scow Bay Turnaround that was approved by the voters; and will add an additional \$60,000 to the PMPL Headquarters Building Remodel Contingency budget. Ordinance #2017-15 was unanimously approved in its first and second readings.

Appointment to the SEAPA Board of Directors took place at the November 20, 2017 Assembly meeting; however, the process used for voting on the appointments was not entirely proper (an honest mistake by Clerk Thompson) in that a secret ballot is not allowed. The public is entitled to know how an Assembly member votes in nearly all situations. Due to the error in process, Mayor Jensen and Clerk Thompson decided it best to revisit the appointments. Our Borough Charter states that the mayor, with majority vote of the assembly, shall appoint committee, board and commission members that are not elected. Mayor Jensen proposes appointment of John Jensen as the voting member to the SEAPA Board and himself as the alternate member.
