

**PETERSBURG BOROUGH
ORDINANCE #2019-12**

**AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR REPEAL OF CHAPTER 3.42, "UTILITY ADVISORY BOARD", AND
CHAPTER 3.49, "PARKS AND RECREATION ADVISORY BOARD", OF THE CODE OF THE FORMER
CITY OF PETERSBURG (NOW SERVICE AREA 1)**

Whereas, on January 3, 2013 the Election Division for the State of Alaska certified the election results of the December 18, 2012 incorporation election for the Petersburg Borough; and

Whereas, the certified election confirmed the incorporation of the Petersburg Borough and dissolved the City of Petersburg; and

Whereas, Borough Charter, Section 19.08C states that all appointed and elected advisory boards, committees, and commissions in effect at the time of Borough Incorporation shall be dissolved one year after the effective date of the Charter unless specifically continued by ordinance; and

Whereas, the Assembly decided not to draft an ordinance to continue the Utility Advisory Board at their September 3, 2013 meeting and the board was automatically dissolved on January 3, 2013; and

Whereas, Ordinance #2013-21 providing for the retention of the Parks and Recreation Advisory Board failed in its second reading at the December 2, 2013 Assembly meeting and the board was automatically dissolved on January 3, 2013.

Therefore, the Petersburg Borough Ordains, Chapters 3.42 and 3.49 of the code of the former City of Petersburg (now Service Area 1) are hereby repealed in their entirety as set out below.

Section 1. Classification: This ordinance is of a general and permanent nature and shall be codified in the Petersburg Municipal Code.

Section 2. Purpose: The purpose of this ordinance is to repeal Chapters 3.42 and 3.49 of the code of the former City of Petersburg (now Service Area 1).

Section 3. Substantive Provisions:

- A. **Repeal of current Chapters 3.42 and 3.49:** Chapter 3.42 (Utility Advisory Board) and Chapter 3.49 (Parks and Recreation Advisory Board) of the former municipal code of the City of Petersburg (now Service Area 1) are hereby repealed in their entirety.

Section 4. Severability: If any provision of this ordinance or any application to any person or circumstance is held invalid, the remainder of this ordinance and the application to other persons or circumstances shall not be affected.

Section 5. Effective Date: This Ordinance shall become effective immediately upon final passage.
