

**PETERSBURG BOROUGH
ORDINANCE NO. 2013-24**

**AN ORDINANCE OF THE PETERSBURG BOROUGH ADJUSTING
THE FY 2014 BUDGET FOR KNOWN CHANGES**

Section 1. Classification: This ordinance is not of a permanent nature and shall not be codified in the Petersburg Municipal Code.

Section 2. Purpose: The purpose of this ordinance is to adjust the FY 2014 budget for known changes.

Section 3. Substantive Provisions: In accordance with Section 11.09(a) of the Charter of the Petersburg Borough, the budget for the fiscal period beginning July 1, 2013 and ending June 30, 2014 is adjusted as follows:
