With the recent road maintenance payment of \$86,000 received through the Secure Rural Schools Act, there exists an opportunity to increase the amount of paving that can be accomplished this summer in Petersburg. This federal revenue is deposited into Fund 250, which exists to account for and expend these monies on their intended purpose; road maintenance or surfacing.

As you know, the last economical opportunity to take advantage of an asphalt contractor being in Petersburg, without having to fully fund the high cost of mobilization, is upon us. SECON is finishing up with the ADOT North Nordic and Haugen Drive projects this summer.

The Borough has already approved a sole source contract with SECON worth \$532,085 with passage of Resolution #2016-3 for asphalt paving in Petersburg. I would like to propose that the Borough Assembly consider increasing the amount of that contract in light of the latest payment from SRS sources and the desire to decrease ongoing maintenance costs for various roads in and around Petersburg. I propose to add the following work to SECON's paving list:

Street	Location	Description
12 <sup>th</sup> Street	Haugen thru Howkan Street	Repave asphalt in this high traffic area. Remove "hump" at Haugen Drive.
Howkan St.	Downhill lane	Repave degraded asphalt on one half of this road.
Excel St.	2 <sup>nd</sup> thru 3 <sup>rd</sup> St intersection	Expand asphalt paving up Excel St. to 3 <sup>rd</sup> .
Excel St.	South shoulder 1st to 2nd	Pave shoulder to protect street pavement, stop water erosion and provide defined parking lane.
Fram St.	South shoulder 1st to 2nd	Pave shoulder to protect street pavement, stop water erosion and provide defined parking lane.

SECON has quoted a price of \$81,810.00 for the removal of current surfacing, prep for paving, traffic control and paving of 308 tons of asphalt.

As with the recent requests for paving work, the identified roads are all excellent candidates for fresh asphalt surfacing. The high traffic area on 12th Street and Howkan Street is showing wear and will quickly start to unravel more and more. Paving this area will benefit all who frequent

the Hammer and Wikan commercial area, the Airport Subdivision and Mountain View Manor. Widening the paving on Excel and Fram streets will clean up the block around the hospital, prevent storm water from damaging the shoulder of the road and provide improved parking lanes for both of these blocks. Lastly, paving Excel Street from 2<sup>nd</sup> to 3<sup>rd</sup> will connect asphalt pavement on 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> Streets and remove an area of chip seal that is failing fast.

With your consent, this expense will be included in the first supplemental budget ordinance for FY17 and I would strongly appreciate it if you could forward this to the Assembly for their consideration. With dollars getting shorter these days, this opportunity will improve local roads for our citizens, reduce ongoing annual maintenance costs and take economical advantage of a paving contractor that is already in Petersburg. I believe this to be a very prudent expense.

If approved, the work will occur in mid-July when SECON has their paving crew in Petersburg.
