I'm very proud of the fact that PMPL staff handled the diesel support campaign last spring with professionalism and excellent service to the community. Extended 24/7 power plant runs are rare and the operators and other staff at Power and Light stepped up to make sure the lights stayed on and the cooperative efforts with SEAPA and Wrangell Light and Power achieved the goal of retaining Tyee Lake water levels in the midst of the severe drought in our region. Absolutely fantastic work last February and March by the PMPL staff.

I'm thankful for understanding and cooperation of many private property owners that agreed to place the safety and security of the power distribution system as a priority and grant permissions to remove trees that were encroaching on the power lines. I'm also thankful for rain!

I'm extremely proud of the staff's diligence in finding and assisting with the fixing of numerous, large water leaks in the water system this year. It takes many hours of research and field investigation to land on probable leaks in the system and the water staff kept at it until they located "the big one" on 12th Street. Narrowing down the dig area, especially when the water isn't "showing" on the surface of the ground is very difficult. The guys did an excellent job this year. The recent recognition as an ADEC Ursa Major Water Utility is well deserved and a reflection of the dedication of our local water operators.

I'm very thankful for the support and assistance received by many different Borough departments during

the repair of the biggest water leak on 12th Street. PW did the digging and handled the public service announcements and traffic control for the job. PMPL assisted by stabilizing a power pole next to the dig site. Mountain View Manor cooperated by letting us know the best time to do the work. The Fire department was helpful in assuring us that they would be able to respond to a fire even if the water was turned off to the neighborhood. This was a team effort through and through and the support that was received is appreciated!

Karl – Wastewater

I'm proud of the recognition recently received by EPA for the Scow Bay Pump Station 1 Upgrades project. This project has been a long time coming and to receive recognition of a project perfectly suited to the ADEC revolving loan program is an indication that we have our priorities in a good place. Recognition of this kind will help to fund more projects in the future.

I'm thankful for a staff that has a wide range of talents and skills and are happy to use their knowledge and abilities to better the utility, save money when possible and help other departments when asked.

Chris - Public Works has experienced some particularly heavy challenges in the last year and accomplished a lot both individually and as a team.

Streets Dept & Motor Pool: Both of these departments were displaced by the catastrophic fire that heavily damaged the shop building, and they pulled together to keep the Motor Pool and Streets Depts functioning in the aftermath of the blaze – no small task considering many of their tools and supplies were either damaged or destroyed in the fire. The teamwork and "can do" attitude displayed by these depts made a huge difference and turned what was a tragic event into an opportunity to shine.

Chris - Sanitation Dept: Getting the new baler up and running was the highlight of our year at Sanitation. We couldn't have done that without the assistance of our dedicated staff throughout the process.

I am most thankful for all the support we've received throughout our various challenges this year: everyone from other Borough staff and departments to individual community members to former employees who stepped in to lend a hand when needed.
