## A RESOLUTION AMENDING THE EXPENDITURE OF \$778,000 FROM THE CARES ACT SPECIAL REVENUE FUND TO \$642,136 FOR PETERSBURG SCHOOL DISTRICT PERSONNEL COSTS IN RESPONDING TO THE COVID-19 PUBLIC HEALTH EMERGENCY AND IDENTIFYING MODIFICATIONS TO THE SCHOOL DISTRICT'S INITIAL REQUEST

**WHEREAS**, on August 3<sup>rd</sup>, 2020 the Borough Assembly approved a \$778,000 expenditure to provide assistance for the school district's reopening plan to support as much in-person education as possible in accordance with CDC, DHSS, and Department of Education guidelines; and.
