

**PETERSBURG BOROUGH  
ORDINANCE #2016-04**

**AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR FINES IN SECTION 1.16.030, FINE SCHEDULE, FOR VIOLATIONS OF  
CHAPTER 7.04, DOGS**

**Whereas**, Section 1.16.030, Fine Schedule, was adopted January 6, 2014, to set forth fine amounts for violations of municipal code; and

**Whereas**, it is the Borough Assembly's intent to consolidate all such fine amounts into one section of the code, both for purposes of future amendments to the code and for purposes of facilitating enforcement by the police department and the processing and collection of fines by the Alaska court system.

**Therefore, the Petersburg Borough ordains**, the added fine amounts contained in the schedule set out below are hereby adopted for violation of the applicable section numbers of Chapter 7.04, Dogs, and shall be administratively incorporated into section 1.16.030.

**Section 1. Classification:** This ordinance is of a permanent nature and shall be codified in the Petersburg Borough Code.

**Section 2. Purpose:** The purpose of this ordinance is to establish fine amounts for violation of a number of provisions of titles 4, 6, 9 and 14 of the borough code, to provide for a unified fine schedule for violations of the municipal code of the Petersburg Borough so as to facilitate enforcement and collection of such fines, and to provide for injunctive and civil relief for code violations.

**Section 3. Substantive Provisions:**

Chapter 1.16 - GENERAL PENALTY AND INTEREST RATE

Sections:

1.16.010 - Violation—Penalty.

- A. Any person who violates a provision of the Municipal Charter, the borough code, or any ordinance or regulation of the borough shall be guilty of a violation. Except in cases where a different punishment is prescribed, a person found guilty of a violation is punishable by imposition of a fine not to exceed \$1,000.00 for each separate violation or, for continuing violations, for each day that violation continues, plus any surcharge required to be imposed by AS 12.55.039; or, if the ordinance specifically provides, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor punishable by a fine not to exceed one thousand dollars or imprisonment for not more than 30 days, or by both such fine and imprisonment.
- B. In addition to any penalty prescribed by law, a person found guilty of violating a borough ordinance shall pay any surcharge required under AS 12.55.039 and AS 29.25.074.

1.16.020 - Interest rate.

Any amount owed to the borough is delinquent if not paid when due. Except when otherwise provided by law or specifically provided by ordinance, resolution or written agreement, interest at the maximum legal rate allowed by state law shall accrue upon all delinquent fees, charges and assessments owed the borough, from the due date until paid in full.

1.16.030 - Fine schedule.

Citations for the following offenses may be disposed of without a court appearance upon payment of the fine amounts listed below, plus any required state surcharge. If a person charged with one of these offenses appears in court and is found guilty, the penalty imposed for the offense may not exceed the fine amount for that offense listed below, plus any applicable state surcharge.

1.16.040 - Other remedies.

- A. In addition to or in lieu of any fine imposed under this chapter, a civil penalty may be imposed against any person who violates a provision of the municipal code, in an amount up to \$1,000.00 for each separate violation or, for continuing violations, for each day that violation continues.
- B. The borough may bring a civil action seeking 1) injunctive or declaratory relief to enjoin a violation or threatened violation of the municipal code, and/or 2) recovery of a civil penalty.
- C. All remedies for violation of the municipal code are cumulative and in addition to any others existing at law or in equity.

**Section 5. Severability:** If any provision of this ordinance or any application to any person or circumstance is held invalid, the remainder of this ordinance and the application to other persons or circumstances shall not be affected.

**Section 6. Effective Date:** This Ordinance shall become effective areawide immediately upon final passage.
