Mr. Mayor and Assembly members, I have read the 3 draft mandates.

I am in favor of the Face Covering draft mandate as written.

The Harbor Facility draft mandate seems a reasonable request/requirement to make of the cruise industry. My only comment is that the minimum 24 hour submission/request to the Borough Public Health Officer seems a short time frame. The Health Officer probably has a lot on his plate. Consider requiring the notification to the Health officer to be more than "at least 24 hours". Surely a cruise boat will know some days ahead of a planned stop in Petersburg.

The Travel Plans draft mandate seems reasonable and common sense. My comment would be that any correspondence related to the Travel Plan between the Plan submitter and the State should also be copied to the Borough. The Borough will want to know the States response/comment to Plans and any reply from the submitter. One additional thought- The Borough is in a better position to know what business, industries and other entities in Petersburg are covered by State Mandates 10 and 12. Is there a thought to follow up with the State if the Borough does not receive a Travel Plan? Meaning maybe the State did not get one.
