Ordinances for Second Reading

A. <u>ORD#14-20</u> Ordinance #2014-20: An Ordinance Providing Parking Regulations and Fines for Parking Violations and Repealing the Remaining Chapters of the Old City Code (short title).

> The ordinance will finalize the transfer of City of Petersburg traffic ordinances to Borough Code. The Assembly previously adopted Ordinance #2013-25 that listed the State statutes and regulations that were adopted for use in the Borough to address our most common motor vehicle enforcement needs.

B. <u>ORD#14-21</u> Ordinance #2014-21: An Ordinance Adjusting the FY 2015 Budget for Known Changes.

The Ordinance has been amended by staff to reflect the payment of PILT funds to Kupreanof as approved at the October 6 meeting; and to add a request from the Fire Department to provide for a full sized SUV at the cost of \$32,032 through the State cooperative purchasing program. The Fire Department currently has a \$34,181 balance for the unit within the Motor Pool Fund.

B. <u>RES#14-17</u> A Resolution Supporting International Joint Commission (IJC) Involvement in the Alaska/British Columbia Transboundary Region

Petersburg Vessel Owners Association has asked for support of their efforts to urge the United States government to work with the government of Canada to refer transboundary development issues in the British Columbia/Alaska region to the International Joint Commission. The Commission would be charged with using all powers under the Boundary Waters Treaty to ensure our Southeastern Alaska resources are not harmed by upstream development. PVOA has submitted the resolution to Alaska Municipal League for their support.

C. <u>14-327</u> Consideration of Amendment #4 to the Professional Services Agreement with Dowl HKM - Design of Pump Station 1 Force Main Upgrade

The amendment is for \$32,190 and would bring Dowl's total contract to \$219,199. Design of the project is being funded by a \$270,0000 ADEC loan.
