

In June of this year, the Assembly approved a contract with the State of Alaska to supply greeting, screening and testing services at the James A. Johnson Airport in Petersburg. The Borough hired greeters and screeners and entered into a Memorandum of Agreement with the Medical Center for the testing required at the airport. The State has reimbursed the Borough for all expenses associated with the ongoing effort.

The initial contract term ended on August 31 but prior to the expiration the Assembly approved an extension of the contract and agreed to provide services to October 31<sup>st</sup>. I am now in receipt of a second extension amendment from the State of Alaska that seeks to secure the Borough's services until December 31, 2020, with options for additional extensions as required by the pandemic response.

The new extension request will pay the Borough a total of \$423,725.00 for the greeting, screening and testing services (from June 8 – December 31). If the extension is approved, PMC's MOA will be amended to pay them up to \$325,400 for testing services, as outlined in the State's contract and the MOA.

It is in the Borough's best interest to approve extension of this contract to provide greeting, screening and testing services at the airport. A recommended motion would be:

**I move to approve Amendment #2 of the State of Alaska contract C0620-523 to extend greeting, screening and testing services at the James A. Johnson Airport to December 31, 2020 for a total payment to the Borough of \$423,725.00; and to amend the MOA with the Petersburg Medical Center to reflect the extension and setting a not-to-exceed value of the MOA at \$325,400.00.**
