



PETERSBURG BOROUGH PUBLIC HEALTH MANDATE #06
(Submission of Travel Plans)

Issued: April 20, 2020

Revised: February 23, 2021

Under State of Alaska Health Advisory No. 4, it is recommended that certain businesses submit travel plans to the State of Alaska which demonstrate how the business plans to avoid the spread of COVID-19 and protect the communities in which they operate. It is vital that such plans also be provided to the communities themselves, to ensure that local concerns are made known and addressed. Enforcement of the requirements of travel plans will likely be at the local level, as State enforcement is limited.

Accordingly, due to this ongoing public health emergency, it is in the best interest of the safety and health of Petersburg that the recommended travel plans be submitted to the Borough for review and comment. The conditions of this Mandate are designed to provide the least necessary restrictions.

UNDER THE AUTHORITY OF PETERSBURG MUNICIPAL CODE CHAPTER 3.72, THE BOROUGH ASSEMBLY HEREBY ORDERS:

Any business included in 'Critical Infrastructure' that is intending to bring or send workers into the Petersburg Borough and which submits a protective plan to the State of Alaska under State Health Advisory No. 4, is also required to simultaneously submit the plan to the Petersburg Borough for review and comment. If the plan has already been submitted to the State of Alaska, then it shall be submitted to the Borough within 24 hours of the effective date of this Mandate.

The plan shall be submitted to the Petersburg EOC Incident Commander at:

The Commander shall respond to a business submitting a plan with any requested revisions or amendments which would better serve to protect the community, within three business days of submission unless extended by the Commander for good cause, and shall work with the business in good faith to come up with an acceptable plan.

Effective Date and Duration. This Mandate went into initial effect on April 20, 2020 and shall remain in effect during the effective period of State Health Advisory No. 4, unless earlier terminated.

Effective Area. This Mandate is applicable borough-wide.

Passed and Approved by the Petersburg Borough Assembly on February 23, 2021.
